Todd Drake, co-founder and teacher of Insight Meditation Community of Fredericksburg, has been studying and practicing mindfulness for 25 years. His meditation practice is seated in the Theravada School of Buddhism. His personal training includes: The Power of Awareness Training, sponsored by the Awareness Training Institute, and Mindful Self-Compassion Intensive, sponsored by UC San Diego Center for Mindfulness. Todd has also attended numerous silent meditation retreats over the years and is an ardent supporter of practicing mindful selfcompassion.



Simply Mindful

A Day-Long Silent Retreat with Todd Drake

October 19, 2024

We usually think of mindfulness (vipassana) in terms of sitting practice. We sit and follow the breath and whenever a thought arises, we note thinking or feeling, pleasant or unpleasant, then go back to the breath. Taking the one seat, our formal practice, helps to deepen our concentration and see with clarity the nature of impermanence. For many this is enough, which is cool, for meditation opens the mind and brings one a sense of peace and ease. But it is equally important that we take this practice into our daily lives, to be simply mindful from one moment to the next with all of experience, from brushing one's teeth to being present with emotional pain, and so on.

During this retreat, there will be a Dhamma talk on being simply mindful, and guided meditations and exercises to help us experience the unfolding of what is happening without losing ourselves in the selfing-story. We will spend some time outdoors for a mindful walk in the park, and another period of sitting outdoors to simply listen to the world. This retreat is suitable for those new to meditation practice, as well as experienced meditators.

David Brown, Minister

"We are the church you've been looking for."

This is an ad we're planning to run in a local paper soon, and it occurred to me that we (the good people of UUFF) need to commit ourselves to living up to this statement. Are we a church/fellowship that people will want to attend?

Think about someone who is not currently attending any religious service. What do you think would motivate them to attend our weekend gathering? How can we compete with brunch at Amy's? That's a tall order, but I think we have what it takes.

First off, the UUFF needs to be welcoming. If someone makes the effort to show up, we need to appreciate that effort by welcoming them. You likely have a group of friends at UUFF that you typically hang with. I want to challenge you to expand your circle! Just find one person you don't know and encourage them to engage. Maybe you ask them to join you. Maybe you just sit with them for this service. Please commit with me to watch for new people and to make contact.

Second, the weekend service needs to be engaging. I started to say "fun" because fun is engaging, but so is "thoughtful" and "inspiring." It takes a small army of people to pull off a weekend meeting and if you're one of those people, I'm asking you to give it your best! Come prepared and do your part with gusto knowing that we only get one shot at a first impression. Please commit with me to bring your best each weekend.

Third, we all need to refocus our reasons for attending the UUFF. Most people attend a church to "get" something. Especially for visitors, they want to see who we are, how we treat one another, how we "do" church. That's exactly what a visitor should do. But that's not what members should do. Members should come to serve.

Ironically, it is when we serve that we receive the most. If I'm involved in the service I get a lot more out of it. If I'm a greeter, my endorphin levels are way higher from the positive social interaction than a regular attendee. Those who speak up during our discussions and participate in RE classes come away with a much richer understanding and they position themselves to interact with others on much deeper levels.

Please commit with me to making the UUFF the very best fellowship we can possibly be. If we do, I'm convinced we can make our little corner of the world a better place to live. And in the process, find ourselves living fuller and richer lives!
